2) (15 points each) For each of the following, explain why it is an economic reason for government.

3) (25 points) Draw the supply and demand for cigarettes. Illustrate a tax on them. Explain why the curve(s) moved as drawn. What happens to the price consumers pay and the price producers receive.

4) (15 points) At first glance, it would appear that the sales tax is proportional. A bar chart on Page 33 of *The State of Working West Virginia 2008* implies that it is not. Why isn't it?
