1A) (5 points) What is the problem facing Social Security? What are the two causes of the problem?

1B) (20 points) One proposed solution is to increase the Social Security tax. How would that reduce the problem? Would you do that to reduce the problem? Explain your logic.

1C) (20 points) One proposed solution is to increase the retirement age. How would that reduce the problem? Would you do that to reduce the problem? Explain your logic.

2) (10 points each) For each of these events, tell me what happened to the labor force participation rate and the unemployment rate. Explain your logic. Which category of unemployment is affected? Explain your logic.

A) Andrew dislikes his boss so much that he quits his job.

B) Kathy was a steel worker in Weirton, but gets laid off.

C) John was a stay-at-home dad, but now that the children are in school, has decided to look for a job.

D) A ski lift operator in this area in a couple of months.

3) (15 points) Last semester, during the campaign, President Obama stated, "If there is any American without a job who is looking for a job and cannot find one, then we have not done our job." Prove that using Obama's definition, it is impossible for him to do his job. I define the President as having done a good job if the unemployment rate is at full employment. What does that mean and how is it different from what President Obama said? Explain your logic.
